Message from our Superintendent Minister Mark Roberts

The fuss about Easter eggs began early this year. A Conservative MP spotted chocolate eggs on sale in the supermarket in early January, complained that it was too early and sparked a few days of media storm. My feeling is that he is at least 10 years behind the times. I learnt the hard truth about the Easter egg season in my first year of ministry. Realising on Easter Saturday I needed a couple of eggs as a visual aid I headed into Newark and discovered that there wasn't a single medium sized Easter egg in the whole of the town. I learnt then to buy early. The following Christmas I realised just how much earlier that could be, when I discovered shops selling eggs alongside the

Boxing Day sales. The good news is that if you don't want Easter eggs in January you don't have to buy them! Be strong and resist the supermarkets attempt to create urgency and eat more chocolate.

But Easter is something that should be prepared for well in advance. As you get this plan the season of Lent will be about to start. Beginning on Ash Wednesday, which this year is the 14th February, the next 7 weeks are an opportunity to prepare our hearts for the Easter celebrations. Many of you will be joining study groups. Others will be exercising selfdenial by 'giving something up' for Lent. The words of communion services and Bible readings through this time invite us into a journey of self-examination and repentance.

Easter should also be savoured long after Easter day itself (this year on 31st March). The events of the week can seem to rush by: Jesus is welcomed by the crowd, washes the feet of his friends, dies on a cross and then lives again. But Easter can be savoured as well. Its message lasts. Here is new life through the forgiveness and transforming power of God's love. Here is hope because death cannot put an end to God's love. These things will never come to an end.

I pray that you and your churches will know many blessings this year as you prepare during Lent, celebrate on Easter day, and then let the power of Easter work through your life.

Mercy Ships

Leo and Hilary Cheng

Mercy Ships is a Christian international charity that sends hospital ships to some of Africa's poorest nations. Founded in 1978, Mercy Ships offers lifesaving and life-transforming surgery to people who do not have access to such treatment either because it isn't available or because they cannot afford to pay.

Leo and Hilary Cheng have recently joined the Nottingham South Circuit. Leo is an Oral, Maxillofacial, Head and Neck Surgeon serving in London where he performs surgery on patients with head and neck conditions. Hilary is a retired Methodist Minister who is currently working part-time in the Circuit.

Each year, Leo and Hilary join the Mercy Ship in whichever African country it is situated and offer 2 weeks service on board ship.

Leo can do 10 to 15 surgeries, depending on the complexity as well as seeing patients in clinic for pre and post operative review. Whilst he is occupied, Hilary works as a ward Chaplain offering pastoral care to patients and carers on the wards.



In general, everyone who works on the ships is a volunteer and funds their travel and accommodation costs, enabling money raised to go directly towards the running costs of the ship and the surgical service it

provides.



The ship's motto is "to bring hope and healing to the world's forgotten poor". Leo and Hilary have seen and been part of this miraculous healing ministry. If you would like to know more, please email them at: Leo.cheng2@btinternet.com
