This week my cousin contacted me about four mobility aids that she would like to give away to anyone who might find them useful. The only expense you would have is arranging their transportation from Shropshire. The items were used by my Aunt who passed to glory last year. They are:-

Caroflex Hydro Tilt Chair

Bought in October 2023 used for 10 months cost £2,743 It can also be used as a wheel chair inside the home.

Karma Falcon Powerchair

Bought in October 2022 used for 5 months,

Ibis Pro Tilt in space wheelchair.

Bought in October 2024 costing £4225 used inside only for around a year.

Opera Profiling Bed

Bought in October 2021 for £3,070. In good condition used for 1 year 4 months.
